# **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MESSAGE**



The question I get most often now is, "So, have you settled in yet?" Yes, I'm definitely feeling more comfortable with my role and the organization. However, YCAP has a broad-reaching and complex array of services that touch so many lives throughout the county. There remains much to learn and explore.

Late last year I continued to travel throughout the county, speaking to service clubs and meeting with our

Board members and other civic leaders in their communities. I shared the depth of YCAP's services and discussed opportunities to build partnerships and meet common goals.

In November we initiated our newest fundraising event, "Light the Fire," in Newberg. It raised awareness of what we do and attracted dozens of new supporters. We will also host our second annual "Hooley" fundraiser on March 18th. More info about both events can be found in this newsletter. In addition, our holiday season resource drive was very successful. From our 50/50/60 Food Bank campaign, First Federal's Blanket and Books donations, the Community Cantata Choir concerts, and much more, individuals and organizations were extremely generous with their contributions.

On January 27th we led our eighth county-wide "Point in Time" (PIT) homeless count. Over forty volunteers and our entire Client Services staff were in every community, conducting surveys and offering food, socks, tarps and other essentials to those with no permanent shelter. On the same

day, YCAP also supported the Yamhill County Veterans' Stand Down. This event provided service and job resources for veterans, with emphasis on those who are homeless. In February we began planning and budgeting for our next fiscal year, which starts July 1st. I won't go into the mindnumbing details, but what is exciting are the innovative new projects and programs we're considering to better serve our clients. More about them will be unveiled this summer and in our next newsletter.

I was at an event a couple of months ago that brings the homeless and other members of the community together for dialogue and better understanding. There I met a volunteer who really left an impression on me. She shared how many years ago she was homeless and came to YCAP for assistance. Her case manager diligently worked with her, kept her focused on the right goals, and helped change her life. This woman is now employed full-time, loves what she does, and was so appreciative of what YCAP did for her. It is those stories that make this work so fulfilling.

I continue to be impressed by the care and commitment of our staff, and the hope they give to our clients. We frequently see and hear about crisis and struggle from our neighbors in need. However, we are inspired by their desire to create a better life for themselves and their families, and our opportunity to be a positive part of that journey with them.
